- Know upcoming dates related to budgets, levies, and Election Day.



 The Supreme Court may hear a case on addressing behaviors that occur outside of school on electronic platforms. This may be relevant to responding to behavioral incidents that occur during remote learning. The CDC changed the definition of close contact and transmission guidance, aligning it with the approach already used by the IDPH.IDPH released an updated decision tree with minor changes regarding COVID testing and negative diagnoses.
