Discussed ISBE and IDPH updated guidance related to remote learning, social distancing, and mask wearing.

- ISBÉ and IDPH released updated guidance this week related to remote learning, mask wearing, and social distancing (relaxing the standard to 3-6 feet when six feet is not possible).
- While remote learning still needs to be offered in some situations, if districts are moving to in-person learning for most students districts should be flexible with families as they transition back to the building..

Discussed ISBE and IDPH updated guidance related to activities and gatherings.

 Capacity limits will be determined by the event and where it is taking place, however, limits during inperson learning and nonacademic activities during the day are determined by the space and ability to maintain social distance rather than a fixed number. While districts may hold graduations and proms, districts should be flexible and plan for multiple scenarios to allow for the use of appropriate mitigation measures in response to current circumstances.

Discussed student data privacy under SOPPA, COPPA, and PPRA

- Amendments to SOPPA go into effect July 1, 2021 and require school districts to develop policies, procedures, and notice requirements related to student data privacy.
- It's important to know how other data privacy laws such as COPPA and PPRA relate to SOPPA.
- Districts should review current applications/programs used with the district, determine who can enter into contracts with technology vendors, and consider the data privacy agreement requirements when renewing or entering into service agreements with technology vendors for next year.
