

Discussed vaccinations and reactogenicity . . .

- Districts should be aware of reactogenicity, or the expected adverse effects of the vaccine.
- We anticipate IDPH will be releasing guidance to assist districts in distinguishing between expected adverse effects and symptoms of COVID-19.
- It is important to remember that being vaccinated does not result in 100% immunity.

## Cassie



- New regulations went into effect last spring with changes to training, policies, and reporting requirements.
- These restrictive interventions should only be used when the student's behavior presents an imminent danger of serious physical harm to self and others and other less restrictive interventions have been tried and proven ineffective.
- Consider whether additional PPE may be necessary to protect students and staff in the event these interventions are required.



Discussed updates on Illinois sports and and EO on transgender student rights...

- IHSA has approved a sports schedule for the remainder of the year and winter sports are able to begin practicing.
- Tiers, phases, and risk of the sport all impact when and who teams can play.
- President Biden signed an Executive Order clarifying an inclusive position on transgender student rights.
