- Another recent decision regarding an off-duty police officer highlights the tension between the need to discipline staff when outside conduct impacts their performance at work, while also balancing the risk of becoming responsible for an employee's conduct outside of work.

Discussed updates in special education...

- If districts receive a doctor's note indicating a student needs continued remote instruction, this may trigger a child find obligation.
- Requests for recovery services due to COVID should be considered by the student's IEP team
- It is recommended that districts continue to teach students how to wear masks, as it is likely this will continue to be a requirement for quite some time.

- While the number of Illinoisans who are fully vaccinated continues to be below the national average, it was just announced that the United Center will become a mass vaccination site.
- Individuals in the 1b+ category are now eligible for the vaccine.
